#### Pastoral Reflections

#### "And You Shall Know the Truth, and the Truth Shall Make You...Odd!"

That's right. "The truth shall make you odd." Flannery O'Connor said that. And she ought to know. She lived it.

O'Connor is a matron saint of Georgia writers. Occasionally, I've slipped away for a day and made a pilgrimage to O'Connor's Promised Land: Andalusia near Milledgeville. It is a quiet, dusty place to muse among the descendants of her beloved peacocks.

If you've read her stories, know about her life, and heard what she's said about religion and culture...it is all odd. She drafted grotesque images, conscripting them to speak her angular truth loud enough for those who have ears to hear.

I thought of her as I preached on Simon (bar Jonah) Peter last week. He was compelled by our odd God to go beyond the edges of his Bible. Peter took the odd, but Good News of God, outside the church's comfort zone. In so doing, the grace of God (and the salvation of the church) leaped forward.

O'Connor said, "All human nature vigorously resists grace, because grace changes us and the change is painful." Yes. Most of us want change...as long as we feel good and nothing is different.

A staunch Roman Catholic, she coined the phrase, "the Christ-haunted south," because there was so much Christianity, and the lack of it, at the same time. She also said, "People don't realize how much religion costs. They think faith is a big electric blanket, when of course, it is the cross. It is much harder to believe than it is not to believe."

She was concerned that the church, particularly in the kingdom of the south, had lost its distinctiveness. It had become a curator of culture...more warm electric blanket, than demanding cross.

She did not sugarcoat the difficulty of being the church. "It seems to be a fact that you have to suffer as much *from* the church as *for* it; but if you believe in the divinity of Christ you have to cherish the world at the same time that you struggle to endure it."

Oh, how we need her insightful eyes behind her horn-rimmed glasses, today! From her small writer's desk she prophesied to the church, as much as she did for it. She refused to allow the church or the south or Americans to live in silent self-deception.

She struggled with lupus; and it eventually took her life. But it did not silence her voice. Her odd ways, her in-your-face characters, her words which mirror our sins and call for our salvation...all live on.



If Simon bar Jonah weren't in the Bible, Flannery O'Connor would have invented him. Like she said, "A story always involves, in a dramatic way, the mystery of personality."

She was odd. And at our best, we of Northside Drive Baptist are odd. Like she said, the odd truth of God makes us so.
